Ongoing Continuing Projects

Arboretum — Working with other community organizations, the EAGC contributes funds to purchase native trees to be planted at the arboretum at East Aurora High School on Center Street in East Aurora.

Blue Star Memorial Marker — Our Garden Club continues to participate in the annual "Wreaths Across America" service by placing a wreath at the East Aurora VFW Blue Star Memorial Marker site.

Civic — Members plant and provide weekly maintenance (including tilling, weeding and edging) of summer annuals and fall bulbs at the traffic circle and at the nearby pocket park in East Aurora.

Horticulture — In May members receive a horticulture specimen to grow. The plants are critiqued in the fall for educational purposes.

Millard Fillmore Gardens — Seasonal weekly maintenance of period perennial and shade gardens which are open free to the public, and located at the Millard Fillmore House in East Aurora. Members of the club decorate the house exterior at Christmas.

Scholarship — Our Garden Club awards a \$1,500.00 scholarship annually to a qualified graduating senior from East Aurora or Iroquois High School, who has chosen to continue his/her education in agriculture, forestry, horticulture, landscape design, environmental science or a related field.

The first recorded home meetings and a flower show highlighting zinnias took place in 1926, with women clad in classic dresses, nylons, hats and gloves. Over the decades, these caretakers helped nurture not only their home plants and gardens, but also their communities. As multiple wars, the Great Depression, women's rights, and civil unrest unfolded, club projects have included development of our train station grounds, hiking trails, our parks, store front displays, museum grounds, and more recently, our beautiful traffic circle.

A quote from the 1936 yearbook by John Lubbock, seems to sum up our common goal. "All those who love Nature, she loves in return, and will richly reward, not perhaps with good things as they are commonly called, but with the best things of this world - not with money and titles, horses and carriages, but with bright and happy thoughts, contentment, and peace of mind."

We have endeavored to cultivate our spaces, gain knowledge of nature, all while cultivating long lasting friendships.
